Pre-procedural scheduling instructions:

- You must have a driver bring you to the procedure. Uber/Lyft is not acceptable. The driver must be present when you check-in.
- You cannot be ill or taking antibiotics/antivirals.
- If you are taking any blood thinners or anti-inflammatories, please discuss with staff so they can advise you as to when to hold the medication. (See Last Page)
- If you are taking any herbal supplements, please discuss with the staff so they can advise you as to when to hold the supplement.
- If applicable, bring your glucose monitor. Levels need to be below 200 prior to procedure.
- No vaccines (Flu, Covid, Shingles, ect..) 2 weeks before or 2 weeks after your procedure, please notify staff.

Pre-procedural arrival instructions:

- Most procedures will require you to lay flat on your stomach.
 - o If the procedure is at Valencia Mesa, only a light meal is recommended.
 - If the procedure is Fullerton Surgical Center or Plaza, nothing by mouth starting midnight the night prior to the procedure.
- Wear loose fitting clothes and shoes, as you will be changing into a gown.
- Leave your valuables at home and do not wear any jewelry. We do not have a secure location for you to lock up belongings.
- Please check-in 20 minutes prior to your scheduled appointment time if you'll be
 receiving the procedure at Valencia Mesa. For Fullerton Surgical Center please checkin 1.5 hours prior to your scheduled appointment time and Plaza, please check-in 2
 hours prior to your scheduled appointment time. We have a short grace period and
 may cancel your procedure.

Pre-procedural clinical instructions:

- Please update staff of any medications and/or allergies.
- Take your blood pressure medications, heart medications, and/or anti-anxiety
 medications as prescribed. If you have an implantable device, such as a pacemaker or
 defibrillator, please notify your physician.



- If you become ill or have an infection, start taking your antibiotics or antivirals and notify the office immediately. Procedure will need to be rescheduled to a later date when you're healthy.
- If you become pregnant or think you may be pregnant, please inform the office. Your procedure may need to be rescheduled for your safety and the safety of your child.

Post-procedural instructions:

- If you are an established patient, please ensure you have a follow-up appointment scheduled.
- If you were referred for a procedure only, please follow-up with your referring provider.
- After your procedure, please do not drive, operate machinery, make any major decisions or consume alcohol until 24 hours later.
- Do not enter any pools, hot tubs, lakes, streams or oceans for 24 hours.
- Please rest for 24 hours post procedure. You may resume normal activities, as tolerated, after 24 hours.

*Do <u>NOT</u> take Garlic, Gingko Biloba, Ginseng, Turmeric, Krill oil or Fish oil for a full 7 days prior to your procedure. *

For Procedures at FSC/Plaza that require Conscious Sedation-

Please READ/FOLLOW the medication instructions below; Please review your medications; GLP-1 medications should be withheld before the procedure involving anesthesia. Your medication may not be on the list as there are many medications within the class. If you are taking medications daily or weekly for diabetes or weight loss, please inform our office and surgery center.

For WEEKLY doses: Do NOT take dose within 7 days from procedure.

For DAILY doses: Do NOT take dose day before procedure and the day of the procedure.

INR Pre-Procedure Level

If you are taking coumadin, warfarin or another blood thinner that requires INR checks at the coumadin clinic. You must have your INR levels checked at the coumadin clinic within about an hour of the pain management procedure, or your procedure will need to be rescheduled.

If you are an established patient of the coumadin clinic, please call (714) 446-5050 today to schedule your INR check prior to your procedure.

If you are not an established patient at the 2nd floor coumadin clinic a referral will be processed, and you will be called to schedule a coumadin check.
